
ACUTE CARE HOSPITAL ADMISSIONS PER 100 POPULATIONS

In 2014, the 28 European Member States of the European Union have registered on average 15.9 admissions in acute care hospitals every 100 inhabitants.

However, this ranged between Austria (24.5 admissions per 100 inhabitants) and Cyprus (7.8 admissions per 100 inhabitants).

Between 2000 and 2014, the average rate of acute care admissions in the European Member States dropped off by 0.6 unit. It decreased by 0.6 unit in EU15 and by 0.5 units in EU13.

The major decreases were registered in Latvia (-5.4), Italy (-5.2), and Romania (-4.8). The higher increases were registered in Greece (+3.4), Germany (+3.6) and Malta (+7.0).
